



Shawl Collar Baby Jumper

This preppy Jumper will make your little dude look so cool.

3-6 months - 150g

6-9 months - 200g

9-12 months - 250g

12-18 months - 250g

18-24 months - 300g

Needles: 4.50mm

Tension: 24 stitches & 24 rows to 4 Inches using rib (slightly stretched) on 4.50mm needles

Yarn: Aran/Worsted/10PLY

Back

With 4.50mm needles cast on 62 (66,74,78,86) stitches

1st row: (right side) K2, P2 across

2nd row: P2, K2 across

These two rows form the rib

Back Cont...

Continue in rib until back measures 5 ½ (6, 6 ¾, 7, 8 ¼ inches from cast on edge ending with wrong side row.

Bind off 2 stitches at beginning of next 2 rows. 56 (60, 68, 72, 80) stitches **

Continue in rib until back measures 9 ½ (10 ¼, 11 ½, 12 ½, 14 ¾) inches from cast on edge, ending with wrong side row.

Bind off 17 (18, 21, 22, 25) stitches - rib to last 17 (18, 21, 22, 25) - bind off last stitches.

Leave remaining 22 (24, 26, 28, 30) on holder for collar.

Alternate Finishing:

Place the 2 lots of 17 (18, 21, 22, 25) stitches onto a holder & do the 3 needle bind off with the front piece stitches to give yourself a lovely smooth shoulder seam.

Front:

Work as for back to **

Next row – Pattern for 21 (23, 27, 29, 33) stitches, turn and work only on these stitches for first section of neck shaping.

Work 1 row

Decrease 1 stitch at neck edge on next row and 3 (4, 5, 6, 7) following 4th rows.

17 (18, 21, 22, 25)

Work even until the front measures the same as the back to the shoulder, ending with wrong side row.

Bind off.

With right side facing, rejoin yarn to remaining stitches, bind off centre 14 stitches, pattern to end.

Complete to match the first side of neck shaping.

Alternate finishing:

Place the two lots of 17 (18, 21, 22, 25) stitches onto a holder & do the 3 needle bind off technique with the back stitches to give yourself a lovely smooth shoulder seam.

Sleeves:

- With 4.50mm needles cast on 42 (46, 50, 54, 58) stitches

- 1st row: (right side) K2, P2 across

- 2nd row: P2, K2 across

- These two rows form the rib

- Work 20 rows of rib

- Continue in rib increasing 1 stitch at each end of the 20th row and every following 4th row until there are 54 (60, 66, 74, 78) stitches.

- Work even until sleeve measures 8, 8 $\frac{3}{4}$, 9 $\frac{1}{2}$, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$, 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches from cast on edge.

- Bind off.

Shawl collar

- With right side facing & 4.50mm needles, rejoin yarn to 22 (24, 26, 28, 30) stitches of the back neck. Cast on 4 (stitches, K2, p2 these stitches, rib to the end.

- Next row (wrong side) Cast on 4 stitches, p2, K2 these stitches rib to end.

- Repeat these last two rows 5 times more (70, 72, 74, 76, 78) stitches.

- Work in rib for 12 rows

- Bind off loosely in rib

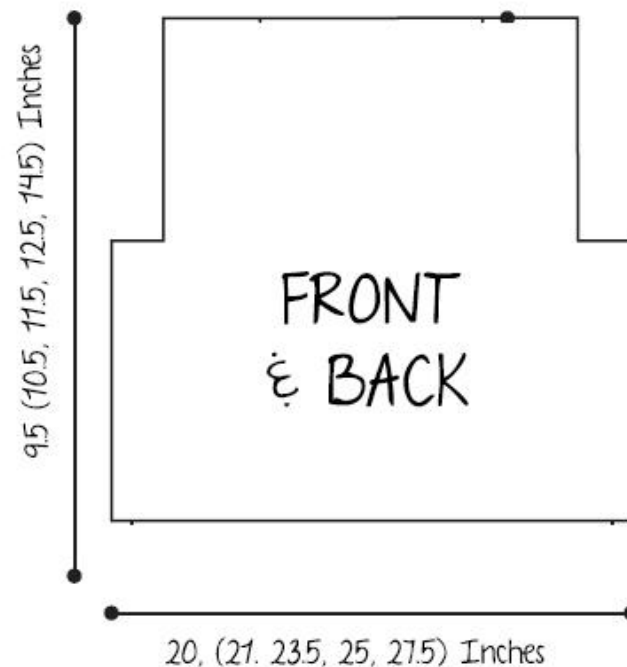
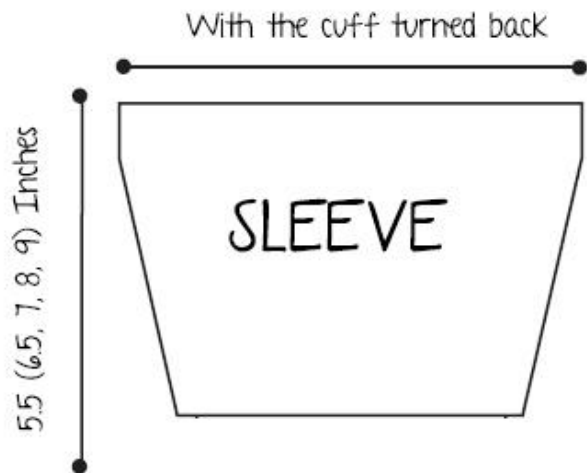
Finishing

Sew shoulder seams, or join using 3 needle bind off.

Sew sleeves into armholes.

Sew side and sleeve seams, reversing bottom of sleeve seam to accommodate the cuff.

Sew cast on edge of collar to neck edge, overlap the two sides of the collar, sew in ends of collar fronts.



3 Needle Bind Off

Step 1: Take the two pieces of knitting and place them right sides facing each other. (I use DPNs)

Step 2: Take a third needle and slide it into the first stitch "knit-wise" on the needle closest to you.

Step 3: Take the third needle and slide it into the first stitch "knit-wise" on the second needle.

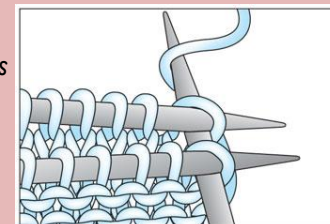
Step 4: Wrap the working yarn around the third needle.

Step 5: Pull the stitch through both stitches.

(as if they are one stitch)

Step 6: Pull the stitches off the two needles creating one on the third needle. (repeat once)

Step 7: Take the first stitch on the third needle and slip it over the second. (like a normal bind off).
